PhD in Geography and Bachelor's Degree in Social and Cultural Anthropology. Two six-year periods of research recognised by ANECA (2012–2017; 2018–2023). My professional career has taken place in the Faculties of Humanities, Law, and Experimental Sciences at

Universidad Pablo de Olavide, with more than 14 years of teaching experience in undergraduate and postgraduate courses. I currently serve as Vice-Dean of Quality in the Faculty of Humanities. My main line of research has focused on the qualitative analysis of social perceptions and imaginaries and their influence on socio-spatial processes, migration and residential segregation in the city. I also analyse the relationship between the attitudes of the host society and the processes of residential segregation and their maintenance over time. I have currently focused my research on the analysis of the main territorial vulnerabilities from a socio-environmental perspective. All this is done using a qualitative methodology based on the application of discourse analysis, also using the possibilities offered by spatial analysis and statistics. I have been the principal investigator (PI) in the Horizon PEARLS H2020-MSCA-RISE project. I am currently the PI of the European SUP4SUD project. I have been a member of scientific committees and organiser of scientific events such as the XIV National Population Congress in Seville (2014) and the scientific committee of the XII Congress on Geography Didactics (2018). I also served as director of the XI Congress on Geography Didactics held at Pablo de Olavide University (November 2016). In 2026, I will participate in the scientific committee of the upcoming 19th Spanish Population Congress and 3rd International Congress on Population Geography, to be held in Almería from 27 to 29 May. At this congress, I will also be responsible for the first presentation, on International and internal migration: dynamics, impacts and challenges. Among my research results, I would highlight my most recent participation as a speaker at various international conferences, seminars and symposiums like the Eleventh Social Science Methodology Conference of ISA RC33 held in Naples, 22–25 September 2025; ESA RN27 Midterm Conference Territories, communities and sustainability: views from Southern Europe, Lisbon, 21–22 September 2023. European Population Conference 2022. Organised by the European Association for Population Studies (EAPS), Groningen, 29 June to 2 July 2022; Centenaire de l'Union Géographique Internationale (UGI). Paris, 18 to 22 July 2022.

In turn, I have been constantly involved in editorial activities as a member of the editorial team of three journals: Humanities and Social Sciences Communications, Journal of Regional Research. Investigaciones Regionales and Spatial Demography. I have currently been invited to participate as guest editor in the special issues of European Urban and Regional Studies.
