






The international Center was officially founded in 2002 although our first semester program began in the fall of 2001

# Frequently Asked Questions





## When is the International Center open?

Monday – Friday 8:00am-3:00pm

Our staff is working 50% in-person, 50% virtually

8 people limit in the International Center.

Masks must be worn at all times.

## Is the library open?

- It is currently open at 50% capacity from 8:30am – 3:00pm Monday-Friday.
- In order to reserve a seat in the library, you must download the app called **Affluences**.
- Books must be reserved online. You will receive an email telling you when you can pick it up.



## How does the wifi work?

- “eduroam” is the secure network at UPO

### Instructions to connect to Eduroam from an Iphone / Ipad / Mac

1. Connect to the internet.
2. To connect to wupolan (an open network available on campus only) you will need your username and password. When you connect, your browser should pop up with a login window. Log in with your UPO username and password.
3. Open Safari, type in: <https://www.upo.es/cic>
4. Once you are on the main page, look for the pink square on the left side of the page which says “Zona Wifi”.
5. Click on the last link on the web page, called “eduroam.mobileconfig”, to download the profile.
6. The profile will pop up and will ask you to install it on your phone, click on Allow.
7. Go to Settings> General> Profiles, where you should find the eduroam profile.
8. Click on “Install” and follow the steps. It will ask you for your username and password, where you’ll need to type in your UPO ones.
9. Once the profile is installed, click on “done” on the upper right corner and head to Settings> Wi-Fi, and click on eduroam to connect. It can fail at first, keep trying. When you connect, the certificate window will pop up asking you to accept it. Click on Accept.

### Instructions to connect to Eduroam from an Android phone/tablet

1. Activate your Wi-Fi.
2. Go to Settings.
3. Select Eduroam network.
4. Change EAP Method to TTLS.
5. Once the EAP Method is changed to TTLS, you should be able to change Phase 2 Authentication to PAP.
6. Type your UPO username where it says Identity.
7. Leave blank the space for “Anonymous Identity”.
8. Type your UPO password in “Password”.



## How are the classrooms set up?

- All of the classrooms are adapted so that there are 1.5 meters between each student. Seats are marked with a “sit here” or with an X where you shouldn’t sit.
- We ask all students to use the hand sanitizer at the entrance of the classroom as they enter.
- Disinfectant and paper towels will also be available for students who wish to clean their desk before sitting down.
- Windows will be open.
- You must keep your face mask on at all times.
- To meet with your professor during office hours, remember that this can only be done virtually, by appointment.



## Can I follow some of my classes online?

Once the classes are in-person, only students who are physically outside of Seville and who signed up as virtual students may follow the classes online.

If the University Covid Commission or current Covid-19 case numbers prevent us from having in-person classes, classes would go back to being online but both weekly sessions would be synchronous.



## Are we continuing with the same absentee policy during the in-person portion of the program?

Yes. As a reminder:

One absence: no consequence although we encourage you to avoid missing any classes due to the shortened semester

Two absences: 2 points off of your final grade (Spanish scale of 1-10)

Three absences: 5 points off of your final grade (Spanish scale of 1-10)


Four absences: Final grade of 0
